Volleyball CAMPS



Steven Gream Head Volleyball Coach



Steven Gream has completed his third season as head coach at Cowley College, having taken the head coaching position in April 2016. In the 2018 season, he led Cowley to a 33-7 record and a second place finish in the KJCCC. The team was honored with three All-American awards, four All-District awards, and four All-Conference awards. In the 2017 season, he led Cowley to a 5th place finish in the NJCAA DII national tournament, a 40-7 record, and a District N championship. The 40 wins was the third most wins in program history and the most wins since 1979 for the program. Gream was awarded the District N Coach of the Year award for the success of the team in 2017. The team was honored with three All-American awards, four All-District awards, seven All-Conference awards (the most in the conference), one Freshmen of the Year award, and one NJCAA national tournament All-Tournament team award. In 2016, his first season, Gream led the Cowley Volleyball team to a KJCCC conference co-championship and a 25-9 overall record. The team was honored with two All-American awards, four All-District awards, and four All-Conference awards.

Gream came to Cowley College having served six seasons as head coach at Southern Arkansas University (NCAA DII). There he raised the bar of expectations, performance, and confidence within the program. Since taking over the program in 2010, Gream guided the program to a record of 111-87 (more wins than the previous seven years combined). In just his first season at SAU (2010), Gream orchestrated one of the greatest turnaround seasons in NCAA Division II history as his team won 19 more matches than the previous year, and ended with a 20-12 record. It was the school's first 20-win season since 2003. In his third season in 2012, Gream enjoyed his most successful year at SAU as the Lady Muleriders posted a 23-12 overall record. The 23-12 mark that season was also the second-best team record for SAU since the program joined the NCAA Division II ranks.

In each of his first four seasons at the helm, Gream posted a winning season, marking the first time that the SAU volleyball program has had four consecutive winning seasons since the mid '90s. Additionally, Gream led the program to their first ever post-season play as he led the Lady Muleriders to five-consecutive Great American Conference (GAC)

Volleyball Championship Tournament appearances. In their first two trips to the GAC Tournament (2011 and 2012), Gream and his Lady Muleriders would win their opening game to advance to the semi-finals. Those two conference tournament wins, under Gream's tutelage, are the first for SAU since they joined NCAA Division II in 1995. In 2015, Gream led the team to their first conference championship match in program history since joining the NCAA DII level.

Prior to coming to SAU, Gream spent seven total years coaching at his alma mater, Union University (two years as an assistant and five years as head coach). During his time as head coach, Union posted a record of 121-51 (.700 winning percentage), had four seasons of over 25 wins, won one conference championship, made two NAIA Region XI Tournaments (NAIA Regional tournaments were discontinued in 2007), made one NAIA National Tournament appearance, and received numerous national rankings. As an assistant coach at Union University, Gream helped start the program in 1998. In his two seasons in the role of assistant coach, the program had a 78-18 record, won a conference regular season championship, won a conference tournament championship, two regional tournament berths, two NCCAA national tournaments, and two NCCAA regional championships.

After graduating from Union University with a Bachelor of Science degree in History, Gream spent five years as volleyball coach at his high school alma mater, North Pemiscot High School in Wardell, Missouri. He also served as a volleyball club coach and director of the Jackson Juniors Volleyball Club and club coach for TC Elite. Gream is a member of the AVCA (American Volleyball Coaches Association) where he has served on numerous national and regional committees. In December 2009 and 2018, Gream was honored by the AVCA as part of their Victory Club. This honor was given in recognition of his success as a college head coach in his first five seasons. His overall coaching record is 330-161.

General Camp Information

All campers will need to bring workout gear and athletic shoes. All on campus clinic sessions will be held in the William S. Scott gym. All sessions are open to family and friends to watch. All camps/clinics must be paid in full prior to the start of the camp/clinic. In case the camper pays in full and cannot attend, she may request and receive a full refund except for a \$30 reservation fee. This request must be in writing and must be received by Coach Gream prior to the start of camp/clinic.

Setter/Hitter Clinic - April 27

This camp is for athletes who are learning the basic skills of setting and hitting. Athletes will be taught the correct basic skills for a setter/hitter to succeed. The skills will be broken down into correct footwork, arm swing, hand positions, and set placement. The athlete will receive 5 hours of instruction. This camp is recommended for grades 7-12. The camp will be held 10 am to 12 noon and 1 pm to 4 pm. 5 hours of instruction for the cost of \$80.

Developmental Camp/All-Skills Clinics -

May 25, June 1, 22, 29

Three week, four hour, clinic - meeting from 10am-12pm and 1pm-3pm at Cowley. This session is for athletes who want to better their skills in all areas of volleyball. All the basic skills will be covered. The athletes will be divided by grade/skill level. The coaches will teach passing, serving, hitting, digging, some blocking, and team play. This camp will emphasize skill improvement with individualized instruction and the maximum number of contacts. If players can not make every session, we can charge for each individual session at \$40 per session attended.

High School Camp - July 29 & 30

This camp is designed for 9th-12th graders and will cover all aspects of the game. The 2 day camp will cover the understanding of rotations, general volleyball rules, passing, setting, serving, and hitting mechanics. Each day is 5 hours and the cost is \$90 for two days or \$45 per day.

High School Elite Camp - July 31

This camp offers comprehensive instruction for athletes who wish to do more "Advanced Training" with a desire to compete at the Collegiate Level. The following areas will be instructed: skills development, offensive and defensive team systems, specialized position instruction and, if numbers allow, intrasquad play. 6 Hours of instruction for the cost of \$80. Campers are to have a ride for lunch or bring their own sack lunch.

Satellite Camps - May, June, or July

If your summer schedule does not allow you and your team to travel to our "on campus" camps/clinics, you can bring the volleyball camp to you. We can come to your school and provide a 1, 2, or 3 day camp at your gym. You supply the net(s), the balls, and a minimum of 12 campers. Camp instruction is based on what you the coach need for your program - individual skills, position specific skills, team concepts, etc. Dates will fill up fast.
